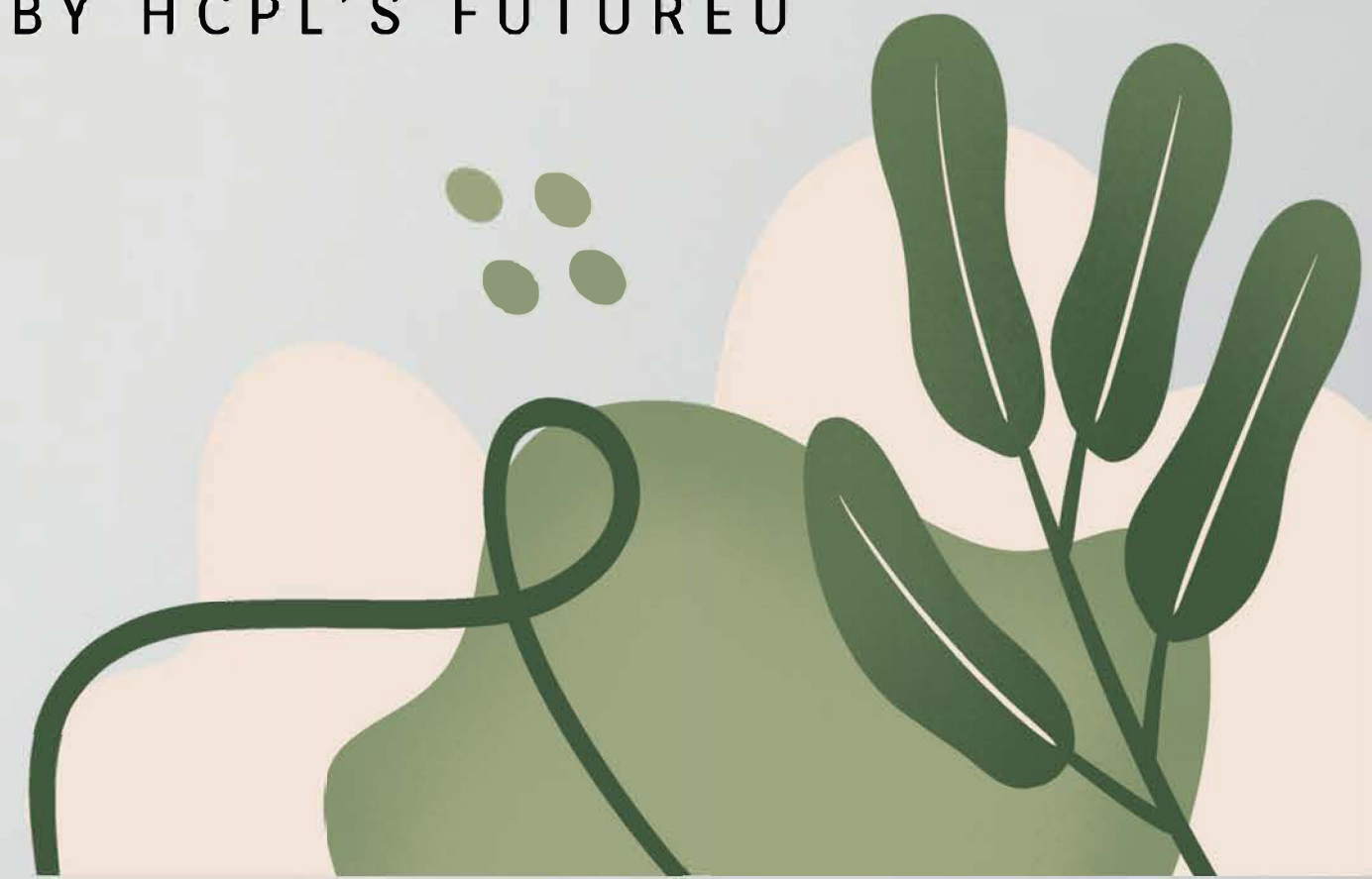




APPLYING TO COLLEGE AS AN UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT

INTRODUCTION


As an undocumented immigrant, there are many limitations on what you can and cannot do federally. However, there are options for you in the realm of higher education! Today, we'll be going over how to apply to college, as well as how to get financial aid.





Can I go to college?

Depending on where you apply, there may or may not be rules in place on the admission of undocumented immigrants. However, there is no federal law prohibiting undocumented immigrants from entering college! That means that, if you apply, the worst they can say is “no.” Please check the policies so you don’t waste money paying the application fee!



Do colleges provide financial aid for undocumented immigrants?

- It depends on the school. Some schools have special funds set aside specifically for undocumented immigrants, especially private schools.
- However, the federal aid form (FAFSA) does NOT allow you to apply as an undocumented immigrant. You also cannot apply for the Pell Grant.
- To check, simply search your ideal school!
- Or you can use CSS: an online application that collects info used by hundreds of colleges and universities to award financial aid outside of FAFSA. You can search by your status to see which institutions allow you to apply for scholarships and grants as an undocumented immigrant:

Many do not inquire about immigration status, and some are specifically made for undocumented immigrants!




THE TASFA

Considering the sheer amount of immigrants in our state, it should be no surprise that there IS a financial aid application for our documented and undocumented immigrant population! The TASFA is the Texas Application for State Financial Aid!

Do not complete both; in your case, you'll likely need to use the TASFA.

A scholarship for low-income, undocumented students.

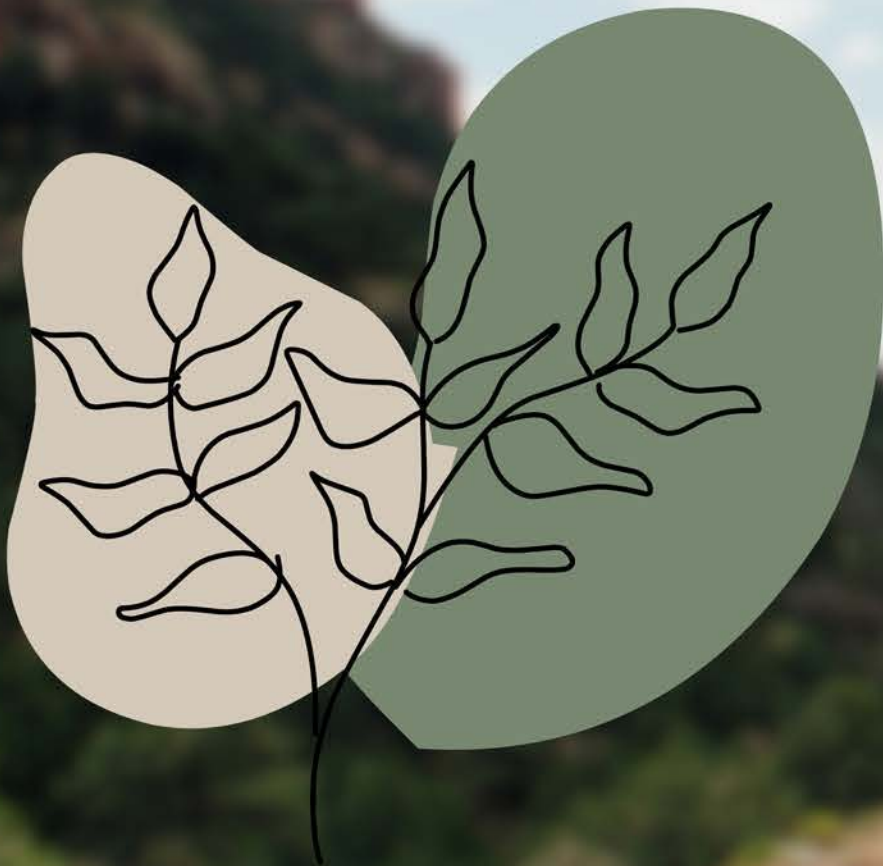
The scholarships include the National Scholarship and the Opportunity Scholarship.
